On the occasions of national and religious festivals these children honour our mother land and its diverse culture. They are given opportunities to excel their talents and became confident while performing their qualities. They danced, sang and acted as they got the chances.

In order to keep them healthy time to time PSSS used to conduct medical camp and awareness classes on basic hygiene like daily bathing, washing and so on. The parents understood the need of it provide them medicines for their normal sickness like fever, cough and cold. They were made aware of and helped the children to do it regularly.



These children never thought that their dream will be fulfilled as they live in the huts. Indeed, it is a joyous moment in the life of four children from the slums got their names enrolled to the St. Theresa's convent school for the normal and proper education. Their parents were motivated constantly and finally they have willingly agreed to send their children to the school.
